## BIRD CALENDAR - APRIL 9<sup>TH</sup>. 1906

The Skunk Cabbage (Symplocarpus foetidus) which ordinarily blooms at Wade Park in late February or early March (March 5, 1905) was in full blossom this season on January 20 (observer, Mr. James), the earliest record known.

Although the winter up to the latter part of February was unprecedently mild and open, no more birds visited us than usual, and the streams of progress northward were checked by cold waves which culminated at about the middle of March. In spite of the mild weather the season, as judged by the birds, is not more advanced than usual.

The following resident birds seen during the winter: Crow (Feb'y. 17), White Breasted Nuthatch (Feb'y. 11), Blue Jay, and Cardinal Grosbeak (Jan'y. 25, C.A.Osborn).
