The following Winter Resident or Visitant birds have been reported from Cleveland and vicinity, during the past winter: Junco, Tree Sparrow, Downy Woodpecker, White-breasted Nuthatch, Tufted Titmouse (4), Cedar-birds (9), Great Horned Owl, Crow, Blue Jay, Red Poll (Jan'y, Feb'y, and March, Macedonia).
