#### BIRD CALENDAR-1911

Bulletin No. 1. March.

The past winter has been of about the average severity, with comparatively little snow remaining for any length of time on the ground. Consequently many birds which usually pass us by, have found feed in abundance, and have wintered here, notably robins, and sparrows and flickers. Bluebirds have also been reported, but probably upon mistaken identification. Only one strictly winter visitor (from the north), the Snowflake, Jan'y. 15, West Park Cemetery; N. T. S. (Normal Training School pupils), has been reported.
