

BIRD BULLETIN No. 2, May, 1912

The severe winter of 1911-1912 was followed by a cold and protracted spring. Judged, however, by the flowering of fruit trees and the arrival of migratory birds from the south, the present season is little if any behind the average. That we are able to present fuller lists than ever before, embracing nearly 100 species of birds, is due to the enthusiastic efforts of a few observers, and mainly to the zeal of Mrs. Ryder and Mrs. Ruedy, of Noble Road, Cleveland Heights. Mrs. Ryder has explored the same territory (vicinity of Noble Road, from Mayfield Rd. to the ridge) daily since the first of March, so that the record for that locality is exceptionally complete. To avoid repetition entries from this source are usually starred.

2. Nesting and other Activities.

1. Cardinal Grosbeak; March 27, in top of elm on Adelbert Campus, loud mate-calls and song lasting five minutes.
2. Bluebird; Apr. 4, nest Euclid Ave. Cleveland; Nest begun in bird-box Apr. 8, finished Apr. 9; later dispossessed by house sparrow.
3. Phoebe; two fresh eggs found, one in garden walk, and one on a pile of lumber, a few yards away; eggs ready before nest.
4. Robin; April 10, Noble Rd. several pairs building; May 2, nest in button button bush of swamp, Noble Rd; robbed, one pierced egg in water below; May 8, pair building in elm Adelbert Campus.
5. Downy Woodpecker; April 28 Cleveland Hts. Nest begun in dead tree 20 feet/ up; drilling lasted seven days, both birds working and dropping chips below entrance, Mrs. Ruedy.
6. Sapsucker; April 14, Cleveland Hts, found clinging to tree, but unable to fly; bird later died, though showing no external marks of injury. Mrs. Ruedy.
7. Red Shouldered Hawk; April 9, Noble Rd; bird seen flying with snake in bill. Mrs. Ruedy.
