BIRDS IS DELAYED
BY KILLING FROSTS

Bird Calendar Shows Effect
of Cold Weather on Migration

Bulletin No. 2 - 18th Year

Attention was called in the first bulletin, issued on March 20, to the fact that the movements of birds are influenced by the weather only as this affects their natural supplies of food. The acceleration of migrants from the south, as noticed this year in the early records of our Robins, Bluebirds and Grackles, was checked by the cold phase which set in on April 11 at the very moment when the early fruits were everywhere breaking into bloom on the Cleveland plain. Contrary to the predictions of the supposedly weather-wise, this cold period culminated in what is known in Ohio as a "black frost" on April 21, when the temperature, according to reports, fell to 20 degrees in the middle and southern sections of the State, and the experience of last year was repeated. Those who urged that Ohio fruits would be safe because destructive frosts are never known to occur in two successive years, will have to revise their theories. The effect of this temperature on fruits was to destroy every open blossom and most fruit-buds, while the migratory movements of all birds which depend mainly upon insects for their food was sensibly slowed down, and there may have been considerable remigration, or a backflow, in certain places.

Cleveland was visited by Jack Frost on at least five nights, on April 20, 21, and 22, and on April 27 and 28; that of the 21st was fatal to all sweet cherries in the more exposed situations, but subjected most other fruits to a thinning process which, owing to the abundance of prospective bloom, they were well able to stand. As has often happened before the fruit crop of northern Ohio was saved by the stabilizing effect of Lake Erie, along the borders of which the temperature probably at not time fell much below 28 degrees. It will be remembered that last year fruits all over the State were mostly ruined by a frost on March 28, when 20 degrees was recorded at Cleveland, and the season was abnormally advanced; what managed to escape was caught mostly in the freezing weather of April 10 and 17.
