BIRD CALENDAR 1929 25th YEAR

Bulletin No. 1, March 31 By Professor W.H. Hulme

Weather conditions have been unusually favorable for Spring migrations in and around Cleveland this year. While there were a few brief blizzards and several heavy rain-storms between the middle of February and the end of March, there were a few but not so many and such sudden changes in the temperature, nor so much snow and ice as marked the corresponding period of the two or three preceding years. But the more favorable weather conditions this year would not seem to have influenced migratory birds very seriously. Few of the "old standbys" were observed before April 1st this year which did not appear before the corresponding date last year. Nevertheless, the First Bulletin this year contains between fifteen and twenty varieties more than the First Bulleting of 1928 can show. This difference is, however, mainly due to the fact that the number of winter residents and visitants seen this year is considerably in excess of that of last year. And this excess is the result, for the most part, of the large number of observers that is reporting this year. For in addition to the "faithful few" who have reported regularly for several years; Dean Bailey and his son Gilbert; Professor Finfrock and Dr. Valentine (who is lending his valuable help for the second year), the force of observers has been increased and strengthened by Mr. D.E. Johnson, a student of Adelbert College, Francis Gilliland, an interested Junior High boy of Shaker Heights, and several fresh irregulars.

As a matter of fact, the present "Bullet [sic] No. 1" is far the largest that has been issued (for the similar period) since Professor Herrick began to keep anything like a regular "Calendar" twenty-five years ago. This is not true, perhaps, of those years (and there were several) in which only 2 bulletins a year were issued. It was indeed, only comparatively recently that some systematic attempt was made to have three bulletins a year, the 1st covering the winter months and March, the 2nd the month of April, and the 3rd, May and the early days of June, - until the Spring migrations are meaSutherland Road, Shaker Hts.ably complete.

An effort is made in the present calendar to keep the record strictly alphabetical, bearing in mind the entire designation of each bird, as it appears to be most familiar to the uninitiated (Examples: American Goldfinch, Belted Kingfisher, Bronzed Grackle, Baltimore Oriole). Apropos, one observer reported the Baltimore Oriole this year for March 21, which must be considered a mistake unless it can be shown that an occasional Baltimore Oriole winters in the vicinity of Cleveland. As a matter of record, our Bird Calendar records the Baltimore Oriole nineteen times during the entire period (24 years) of its existence. This bird's first reported appearances in and around Cleveland have been: 11 times for May, 8 times for April and (to make the number twenty by adding the record for this year), 1 time for March. The April reports are,

with 3 exceptions, for the last week of the month, and the May reports, with 3 exceptions, for the first week of that month. The 3 early April records are April 6, 7, 10, and 2 of these early reports, April 10 and April 6, came from the same very intelligent person, a graduate from the College for Women, who was especially interested in Biological Studies, and resided in the country. The third early report – April 7, 1923, - was given by a presumably equally intelligent person from "E. 84th Street". The writer once expressed a mild skepticism to the reporter of the Oriole from the country so early in April, but she was positive that the bird she saw was a Baltimore Oriole. Chapman does not give much specific help in such cases. Her remarks (Handbook, ed. 1926, p 365), "N. Ohio, common S.R., April 15-Sept. 10;" which being interpreted is "Northern Ohio, common summer resident, April 15 – Sept. 10."

On the whole, it seems safer to believe that nobody has ever actually seen a Baltimore Oriole in the vicinity of Cleveland earlier than the middle of April, and then place on the observer who thinks he has seen one in March or early April, the actual burden of proving it by, perhaps, calling in somebody, if possible, who knows such common summer birds well. This year has been very favorable for such early migrations, if the weather really has much to do with this instinctive annual (or semi annual) business of the birds; but neither Oriole nor Myrtle Warbler, nor "Summer Yellowbird" has been reported by anybody down to today (April 24).

Dean Bailey and Gilbert's faithfully kept record of all the birds that are found in Lake View Gulch between September 30 and about June 1st, shows about the same winter residents and visitors this year that have appeared in their records for the past two or three years. About the same spring migrants – usually so denominated – have lingered in straggling numbers through the winter in Lake View Gulch, or on Oak Road, Cleveland Heights attracted especially by Professor Finfrock's well supplied feeding box.

Dean Bailey's record of southward migrations during October and early November are also worthy of careful study. The following birds bade farewell to Lake View, on the long journey to the far-away south the week following September 30 (1928): Blue-headed Vireo, Catbird, Lincoln Sparrow, Wood Thrush; at least they were not observed after that date. A Swamp Sparrow was seen in Lake View as late as November 1 and November 10; a White-crowned Sparrow on November 1, a House Wren and White-throated Sparrow on October 21 for the last time.

One warm, balmy evening about three weeks ago (April 5) a "Black Bat" was observed flying round above the boulevard close-by the Sovereign, busily plying his usual summer evening trade of gnat- or mosquito-catching.

Every bird on this Bulletin was, with one exception, first seen (or reported) before April 1st.
