BIRD CALENDAR - 1930 - 26th YEAR

Bulletin No. 1, March 31

Winter residents and winter migrants have been observed again in increasing numbers. Whether the larger number of people putting out food both in city and country has had anything to do with this is hard to say. Grain dealers report almost double the sale of food for birds. If this does not increase the number of birds staying with us, it certainly makes life more enjoyable for those that do remain.

For the last few years there has been much debate concerning starlings. From the writer's own observation, and reports from many observers, one can make a statement that has some semblance of correct judgment, that the starlings are becoming adjusted to a new balance in nature and that their number is not on the increase.

Dean Henry Turner Bailey reports observing in Lake View Cemetery February 2nd and 23rd a Carolina Wren. According to Chapman (Birds of North America, Page 476) this wren is a tolerably common permanent resident in Northern Ohio. However, in the twenty-five years this bulletin has been issued there have been but three reports of the Carolina wren. Mr. H.C. Pallister reported April 1, 1910 that a Carolina wren began a nest on a window ledge of a house in Newburg March 28th and had completed the nest March 30th no eggs were laid.

Dr. Knowles reported observing one on Warner Road May 10, 1914, and in the same year Mr. Storer reported several remaining during the winter of 1909 and 1910 in Wade Park and also quite a number in Macedonia.

Dawson in his "Birds of Ohio" (page 262), while still noting that the Carolina wren is rare in northern Ohio, also notes that "the geographical movement of this species is a typical example of the northward trend to which Professor Lynds Jones has so ably called attention in his recent Catalogue of the Birds of Ohio".

There may be some difficulty in identification which has caused the dearth of reports of this bird, but if this is remembered, that it is the largest of the wrens and the most active, if such a comparison can be made among wrens, some of our many observers should find it and the writer desires reports of each observation.

Quoting from a letter from Mr. C.M. Shipman, is passed on to you an interesting story.

"Philip at Chester Brooks told me a funny thing. He says he thinks that the tame wood ducks at their place (males) are beaten up, as it were, by the wild males which mate with the tame females and the tame males hang around the coops and do not go out for that reason. Wild males and tame females mate and the tame males driven inside by these scrappy wild males. Interesting if true".

Following the usual custom in the present calendar, the record is kept alphabetically, having in mind the entire designation of each bird, as it appears to be most familiar to the uninitiated. Abbreviations are: W.M. – winter migrant; P.R. – permanent resident; S.M. – spring migrant.
